## **Why I want to be a GBD Scientist?**

I am a social scientist interested in health in its all-encompassing spectre, hues and colors, as the field of public health, and as most recently the emerging field of global health envisages to study and advocate for. Having come from a discipline of psychology, trained in clinical neuropsychology and worked in clinical sector for years, and intellectually migrated to global health, I am working in the areas of social determinants of health, global health, health systems strengthening, health policy, sexual health, social epidemiology for past several years. I was trained in interdisciplinary health and social sciences at UNSW Sydney as a prestigious Australian Leadership Awards recipient, focusing on International Public Health issues in India, working on Syndemics Approach and Minority Stress Approach (relationship between multiple social disadvantages, mental health and health-risk behaviors), leading them to be engaged in several forms of health-risk behaviors, further exposing them to an increased risks of getting infected with HIV/STIs and other life risks. I have been associated with the GBD global team, since 2012, and feel privileged to have been able to contribute whatever little I can, while learning and grasping new technologies, techniques of data collection, analysis and interpretations, changing meanings and ways of how we understand data, in its most sacrosanct form in social sciences.

I come from a state named Odisha, which is dubbed as the poorest among all the 30 states of India, and therefore remained as the most underdeveloped in modern terms, with acute poverty of Kalahandi (children eating mango mongrels), to highest IMR and high MMR in India, to Japanese Encephalitis outbreak killing hundreds of tribal underprivileged children in 2016, we have faced the brunt of nature, culture, and politics in its most ugly form. We have been a victim of regular and frequent natural calamities each year, having witnessed 3 major calamities (Super Cyclone 1999, Phyllis, Hud Hud, etc in less than 20 years' time; me being a survivor of the first). So, death, and its allies are a timeless companion, guarding our state in the form of Nanka Durbhikshya (The Great Famine of 1866 during British Colonial Rule). And, we are witness to the grossly insensitive and unscientific public policies, which fail to control population explosion, public health outbreaks, air pollution levels in Delhi and major metropolitan cities, gross inequity in terms of distribution of resources, further hollowing out and burdening the ailing public health systems in India. We have been witness to a major National Health Budget cuts since 2014 (<1.2% of GDP), 80% budget cut to the most important policy and practice for reducing child malnutrition i.e. Integrated Child Development Services Scheme (ICDSS), evidencing a complete policy paralysis, a schism between policy and practices.

Since I came back to India, to serve my country as a part of pledge to Australian AID, I have majorly focused on Mortality and Morbidity in several forms, incidents and patterns of death, illness, disability and risk factors causing death, while working on GBD, and with other teams in India. I have been instrumental in planning, conception and organization of National Trauma Registry in India, as national coordinator of Australia India Trauma Systems Collaboration (AITSC), at JPN Apex Trauma Centre, and National Cancer Registry, National Neurological Diseases Registry at AIIMS New Delhi. Subsequently, I have moved to full-time teaching cum research at a premier University of India, namely Utkal University where I combine Social Science based Health Research, infused with multiple paradigms, methodologies, approaches and worldviews. Currently, I am working on a data-driven study on Childhood Malnutrition in Odisha with colleagues from SCM, Public Health, Health Economics, Public Policy, Polity Studies, etc. I am also engaged, since its inception, in one of the major populist schemes of Government of India, with special importance for the context i.e. Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan (a part of WASH). Currently, I am undertaking a systematic evaluation, generating critical

evidences of its overall impact, and how (if) hygiene as a generic practice could be a goal for each Indian. Most recently, few of the GBD Indian researchers have thought to plan a national and sub-national level rigorous analysis of GBD and Risk factors, unique to our setting, especially focused around BIMARU states (historically disadvantaged states of India).

As Social Scientists, we are trained in Mixed Methods Data Analysis, which infuses both quantitative and qualitative data. My approach is to work on unearthing trends, layers of hidden information and patterns which often, quantitative data may not be able to do. I have used qualitative public health policy based approaches to accomplish few of these tasks. I have always felt inspired, and times honestly struggled with new advanced mathematical and statistical techniques as adopted under GBD work. I have very keenly tried to step my foot, and equip myself with new methods, tools e.g. data visualization tools, etc.

In this context, I see GBD Technical Trainings as a blessing and as a unique opportunity to get exposed to advanced techniques, get refined in my understanding and re-consolidate my thoughts on GBD as an approach, and may be engage in Lewinian Learning-Unlearning-and Relearning Process. I would especially be interested to know, and if at all, contribute in bringing social sciences paradigms, and insights from global health as it unfolds, and advanced data metrics, big data approaches, data mining techniques, so that they can be infused together to assist in global and glocal health and public policy making, and practices.

I am deeply passionate about global health, and would like to work on Indian, and such other developing nations (LMICs), and other geographical clusters e.g. SAARC, ASEAN, BRICS, etc, and contribute in shaping and influencing their health and public policies, based on evidence based advocacy. In this context, I see this training as invaluable, and would be honored if my needs are obliged with a scholarship, facilitating my participation.
